## St. Paul's School for Girls

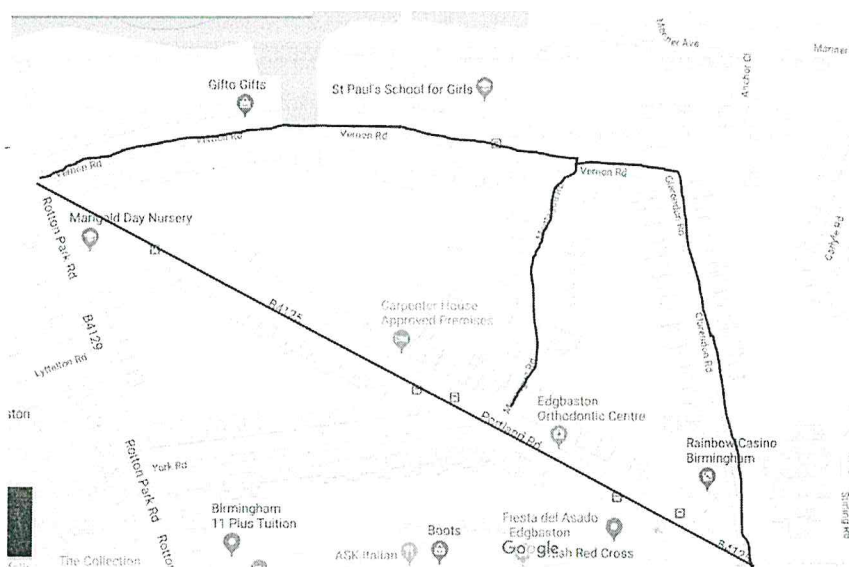

Dear Parents and Guardians,

We have been working very hard to become a Green Flag School, and we have just found out that our application was successful. We will soon be raising our flag as an Eco School. To celebrate this our school has become a host for the annual 'Great Big School Clean 2021'. This programme is in partnership with 'Keep Britain tidy, Eco Schools and sponsored by the daily mail'. The aim of this project is for schools to help improve the environment on their doorstep for our local community by taking part in this Great Big School Clean.

This year St Pauls is going to be a host for the clean-up project. The Eco Club have reviewed the local area and believe we could help to improve parts of the local community. We will be hosting six separate 'clean up' events, which years 7-9 will take part in. This is so we can be in groups of 30 in line with Government guidance for this event during these times.

This will involve the girls as a year group going out into the local area during PSHRE to take part in a litter picking activity. The Clean-up will take place on the roads identified below on the map and around the Edgbaston reservoir.



Girls will be with their form tutor, members of the school Eco Team, the head girl team, members of staff and Heads of Year. Girls will be provided with Hi Vis jackets, litter pickers and all the equipment needed, however if any girls have their own Hi Vis jackets we would appreciate it if they can bring them in on their clean-up day. There are 2.25 million pieces of litter dropped every day in the UK. The Clean-up this year has a focus on crisps. This is also what we are collecting in partnership with Walkers in school. Let's see what difference we can make.
