- At the beginning of Year 7, you will have a KS2 sublevel for English and Maths. Speak to your teacher or Head of Year if you do not know this level.
- We use an average of the English and Maths KS2 baseline levels for all other subjects.
- You will receive a **target grade**, which is based on your KS2 baseline level. You can use the chart on the left to find out your Year 11 **target grade**.
- Your **target grade** is what you should aim to achieve by the end of Year 11.
- Three times a year you will receive a **predicted grade**, which is the teacher's prediction for your final grade.
- The teacher uses classwork, homework and tests to make this prediction.
- If your **predicted grade** is below your **target grade**, then you will receive support to improve.
- If your **predicted grade** is at or above your **target grade** then you are doing really well.
- You should try to achieve at least your **target grade** in every subject.
- After your final exams, you will know your final grade.
