Year 13 March – May

Both teachers will explore sociological theory with you... this will be potentially examined on paper 1 and 3. You have already explored these ideas THROUGH your other topic areas, therefore this work will draw together and extend previous work. Acting as retrieval practice and enabling you to be a synoptic star!

Year 13 Until February

With Mr Gupwell you will be studying the sociology of crime and deviance (paper 3). We will draw upon your previous work on sociological research methods and prepare you a more detailed exploration of sociological theory.

Year 13 Until February

With Miss McCauley you will be studying beliefs in society (paper 2). We will draw upon your previous work on sociological research methods and prepare you a more detailed exploration of sociological theory.

Year 12 March – July

Both teachers will explore sociological research methods with you... this will be examined on paper 1 (with particular reference to education) and potentially on paper 3. We will draw on the research learnt earlier on in the year.

Year 12 Until February

With Ms Tibbits Forrest you will be studying the sociology of education (paper 1). We will draw out many links to sociological research methods and theory which will help you in year 13

With Miss McCauley you will be studying families and households (paper 2). We will draw out many links to sociological research methods theory which will help you in year 13

You will start the course with all the prior skills you have from your deep learning day with us, your GCSEs and all the passions and knowledge you have from your sociological interests and the summer learning you have completed – get ready!

You will have half termly assessments including 2 or 3 PPEs a year – but don't worry we will support you with all of the tools you will need to achieve – aim for progress not perfection! We will model what these pieces should look like in class and give you lots of retrieval practice opportunities to help embed your knowledge
