

Born in 1876, Princess Sophia Duleep Singh was the daughter of the last Sikh ruler of the Punjab, and goddaughter of Queen Victoria. After her father lost control of his empire and was exiled to England, Sophia had a privileged but troubled upbringing that left her unsure about where she belonged – in India or England. Sensitive to injustice, she became a suffragette and fought hard to win the vote for women. This is the extraordinary story of her life.







The Spectaculars


JODIE GARNISH






The Upper World


NON-FICTION RECOMMENDATIONS



Whatever your child is interested in, whether it be topics they've touched on in school, particular issues or current affairs, and indeed their interests in terms of hobbies and sports, encourage them to read around these through non-fiction! We've included a very small sample of some books below, but if nothing catches your eye here, do look up books about things that interest your child, or ask a teacher/librarian for advice!

Grown: The Black Girls' Guide to Glowing Up

MELISSA CUMMINGS-QUARRY & NATALIE A. CARTER

Being a teenager and trying to understand who you are and what you stand for is hard. Period. But if you're a Black girl and don't always see yourself represented in the books you read, the films you watch, the adverts you see or the history you're taught, it can be even tougher. *Grown: The Black Girls' Guide to Glowing Up* was written with one thing in mind: you. From understanding identity to the politics of hair to maintaining squad goals to dealing with microaggressions to consent to figuring out what career you might want, *Grown* has got your back. Natalie A. Carter and Melissa Cummings-Quarry, founders of Black Girls' Book Club, share stories – the wins and the Ls – and offer honest, practical advice that will show you how to own your choices. To live your truth without fear. To be grown on your own terms without limits or apologies.





Steve Jobs: A Biography walter isaacson

The death of Steve Jobs shocked the world. In this book, Walter Isaacson presents the only biography written with the collaboration of Jobs, the definitive portrait of one of the undisputed icons of our time: the chronicle of the hectic life and abrasive personality of the genius whose creativity, energy and desire for perfectionism revolutionised six industries. 


Psychology for Beginners




